N2612-1 proposes to add a RAISED SQUARE and a RAISED SMALL DIAGONAL UPPER LEFT TO LOWER RIGHT symbol, used in New Testament editorial practice. In this usage, the square precedes an example and the diagonal □thus \. In Mediaval Nordicist use, the diagonal is instead paired with a mirrored diagonal \.\text{htus}. This character should be added to the repertoire requested in N2612-1.

The repertoire requested is given here with proposed code positions:
