Canada reviewed the Font Submission policy per WG2 resolution in document WG2 N2754.

With reference to document N2762 WG2 resolves to support the Unicode Consortium's font submissions policy documented at http://www.unicode.org/policies/font_policy.html for the preparation and publication of ISO/IEC 10646 and its Amendments. »

Canada has some reservations about the documentation as is currently posted on the Unicode web site. We note that ISO and IEC were not included in the list of Grantees of the font license in the current documentation. Attached is a proposed revision to the current Unicode Font Submission policy to acknowledge ISO and IEC also as grantees, for review and adoption by WG2 and for forwarding for approval to the Unicode Consortium and to ITTF through appropriate channels.
