Title	Phags-pa Glyphs
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1. Background

At M46 in Xiamen an agreement was reached to use a "Khubilai" style font in place of the font used in PDAM 1 and PDAM 2 for Phags-pa, and this new style of font was used for the first time in FPDAM 2 (N2936). This document highlights a number of discrepancies between the glyph shapes used in the FPDAM and the glyph shapes used in the PDAM. The glyph shapes of Phags-pa letters has been the subject of detailed review by experts, and the shapes of the glyphs in PDAM 2 (N2846) were accepted by all parties (see N2829). Although a change in font style was agreed on, no decision was made at Xiamen to change the basic glyph shape of any letter (see N2922).

2. Glyph Shapes of Letters Ya and Alternate Ya






The glyph shapes for PHAGS-PA LETTER YA [A857] and PHAGS-PA LETTER ALTERNATE YA [A86D] in the FPDAM are significantly different from the previously accepted glyphs for these two letters. As the glyphs in the FPDAM do not reflect the typical shape of these letters in actual Phags-pa texts and inscriptions, there is potential for confusion as to which character is intended to represent which of the two forms of the letter YA. Document N2972 discusses this issue in detail, and recommends that the glyphs for A857 and A86D be modified as shown below, in order to maintain both the agreed font style and the previously agreed glyph shapes.

3. Positional Forms of Glyphs

The PDAM (N2846) used isolate forms of glyphs for all Phags-pa letters. However, in the FPDAM (N2936) a number of letters are represented with initial or medial positional forms, with a hanging stem extension on the right hand side of the glyph. Although a hanging stem extension does occur for the isolate form of some letters in some sources, it is atypical, and isolate forms are best represented without a hanging stem extension.

The suggested glyph forms for these letters are shown in the table below.
