The Holberg project (http://holbergsskrifter.no), a Danish-Norwegian collaborative project, is developing a digital critical edition of the works of Ludvig Holberg (1684-1754)\(^1\). In the course of the project, a character was identified as being needed for the currency symbol for "mark". However, it is not in Unicode. (The character SCRIPT CAPITAL M, U+2133 M, was the symbol used for the German Mark before WWII, but does not represent the Nordic currency symbol.)

This mark symbol was used by Ludvig Holberg in Denmark and Norway in the 17th and 18th centuries. Holberg was a prolific author, who holds a prominent place in both Danish and Norwegian literary history. The "mark" symbol also appears in other written materials (see example [2], below).

According to Wikipedia, the Danish currency system was set up in 1625, with 16 skilling = 1 mark, 6 mark = 1 rigsdaler, and 8 mark = 1 krone (Wikipedia entry for Danish rigdaler), and continued into the late $18c.^2$

The symbol appears after the number (see Examples).
